Updated Message Regarding School Closure – School Closed Through the End of the Year

During today's press conference, Governor Murphy announced that he would be closing all schools through June 30th. As a result of this directive, the Lafayette Township School District will remain closed and on remote instruction through the last day of school, which is scheduled for Wednesday, June 17, 2020. Please know that we share your disappointment as we will not be able to end the year together at school. Information regarding pick up of student items that are left in desks and lockers will be sent out over the upcoming weeks.

Remote Graduation Planning Committee – Given the directive from Governor Murphy regarding school closure through June 30th, we will not be able to host our annual 8th Grade Graduation Ceremony at the school. While we all understand the need for health and safety, it does not lessen the sadness that we all feel in our hearts for these remarkable students who have worked so hard to reach this important milestone in their educational journey! Even though we are unable to have a ceremony at the school, it is important that we honor these graduates and provide them with a special ceremony to acknowledge their accomplishments and wish them well as they enter high school.

At this time we have started to brainstorm ideas and strategies to implement a virtual graduation experience for our students. There are a variety of possibilities for this event, and I would like to invite any of our parents (8th grade parents or parents from other grades who would like to help out) to join our staff and administration in planning an amazing virtual graduation experience for these deserving students! I will be hosting our first Graduation Planning Committee Meeting on Thursday, May 7, 2020 at 6 pm via Zoom. I invite all of our parents to be a part of this committee and help to
